MEET HOLYWELL PRIMARY SCHOOL



HISTORY AT HOLYWELL

History provides children with an array of skills that can benefit them across the curriculum and beyond.

At Holywell, we encourage our pupils to develop a deep curiosity about and respect for the world around them and its history. Our curriculum enables all children - from Year R through to 6 - to develop investigative and research skills and think critically and embrace challenge.

Instead of year groups teaching discrete historical period such as, 'The Romans', we following a theme or thread of learning such as 'Conflict', 'Buildings and settlement', 'Beliefs' and 'Transport and Trade', following the theme through the ages to connect time periods, people, influences and events.

For example:

WHAT DO OUR **CHILDREN SAY ABOUT HISTORY?**

"I really enjoy history because you can see how well we have developed through time." Pupil, Year 6

"I like looking at things that happened in the past, before your time. I like seeing the changes through time". Pupil, Year 3

"I love learning about how people used to live and how different our lives are now. Our learning is fun and different." Pupil, Year 5

"I like it because it is fun to research the events instead of just being told about them." Pupil, Year 5

Teaching through this chronological approach offers clear evidence of how things evolved through time, enabling children to make valuable connections of how such transitions took place and how the world around us has changed over time

Moving forwards, the school's Arts Award advisors are encouraging 'Bronze' level progression for Year 6, which is very exciting! MEET OUR TEAM

Meet Nicky Murrell, Headteacher of Briary Primary School in Herne Bay.

EKC is a unique and special partnership... How is Briary and its community benefitting?

We joined the Trust on 1st March 2020, and, of course, the whole country went into National lockdown on the 23rd. Being part of a strong community, we readily share knowledge and expertise across our schools. Last summer, we held a virtual Recovery Curriculum and Planning session ahead of the reopening for the new school year. We work together closely to deliver joint professional development. Also, it has been really helpful as someone new to headship to have three experienced Heads to turn to for advice and a CEO who knows Briary and its community so well. And whilst the pandemic may have slowed some of our grand plans, we're excited for years ahead.

What can we expect from Briary over the next year?

A year of something approaching normality would be lovely! But, joking apart, we are committed to 'Widening Horizons, Raising Aspirations' as a school. We very much want to do all we can to enrich the curriculum and enthuse our learners about the world of opportunities beyond our doors. If you don't know something is a possibility or available, available how can you dream about it or aspire to it?

We want to have a really close look at our whole curriculum offer, review it. question it and enhance it for our children and our community.

As schools, you're forever inspiring your young people; who or what inspires you?

Lots of people inspire me; I'm fortunate to work with many of them but someone, outside of school, who I think was particularly remarkable, was a young person called Hannah Francis.

Hannah sadly died in 2016 aged just 18, following a battle with an aggressive form of bone cancer. Hannah bravely and publicly shared her fight on social media and established a lasting legacy in the Wilberry Wonder Pony charity, which upholds a mission to "continue #kickingcancersbutt by funding bone cancer research and granting #willberrywishes to those who are ill with horsey dreams."

To achieve all this whilst suffering as she was, and at such a young age, is, I believe,

truly remarkable and an example to us all. www.willberrywonderpony.org

Joining Briary in 2016 on Secondment, Nicky loved it so much she never looked back! With over 20+ years of Primary teaching, she's taught across the phase,

each class offering a "Yes! This is my favourite year group!" moment. With experience leading both Key Stages, she took the step up to Deputy Head on arrival and the rest, as they say, is history.



REFLECTING ON... CATCH UP? RECOVERY? YOU DON'T HAVE TO BE SICK TO GET BETTER.



There is absolutely no doubt that Covid-19 has impacted our communities and impacted children's learning.

But is it fair to label our current pupils the 'Lost Generation'? I think not! I think it's time we shift our gaze... to see the glass as half full rather than empty.

As professionals, we are often the most positive, enthusiastic and optimistic folk around, so let's shift to identifying and investigating our strengths and using this as the platform for developing ourselves, our schools and our communities.

Here are my three top tips:



Let's ban the words catch up and recovery, the connotations being broken, behind or failing. 2020 has not been without its challenges, and we will support pupils who have not made the social, emotional or educational progress they would normally have done. But it is also fair to recognise there have been positives too. Some children have enjoyed more quality family time than ever before. Some have relished and gained from independent learning over the busy classroom environment. Children have built on their resilience and adaptability, and equally, some have managed this very different experience with relative ease.

Understanding the starting point for every child and looking forward is the approach our schools have always taken. Let's support each other in maintaining the positive, aspirational approach that sets out a great learning journey going forward from wherever we start today.



Second, let's challenge ourselves to invest in our strengths! As individuals, we grow most in our areas of strength. Let's take our strengths seriously, leverage them intelligently and develop exceptional provision. Not only does it feel good to be working to our strengths, but it supports a virtuous circle of engagement and performance at every level.



Third, let's celebrate and learn from our successes! You know, the 'what went well?' question. This is an important question, but all too often, we jump ahead to look at the 'even better ifs'. Let's stay with the 'what went well?'; let's explore the what, the when and the how alongside the impact we've made. Let's investigate success as fervently as we investigate opportunities to develop provision. And let's help our colleagues do the same.

Your pupils are where they are because you supported them and they'll continue to achieve and be successful because you continue to look forward, think positively and keep getting better.
