

BRINGING LEARNING TO LIFE



To contextualise all the learning that Year I have done in English, where they have been studying the book, 'One Day On Our Blue Planet', set in the Savannah they visited Howletts Zoo (along with Year R and Year 2). Here they had the opportunity to get up close and personal with the animals featured in their book and learn even more about their natural habitats.

Year 2 have had some egg-stra special visitors this year... Having spent time looking at life cycles in Science, they focussed on those of chicken. Keeping diaries of the developments, it was fantastic to watch the chicks hatch from their eggs and grow into wonderful little animals. The children took so much from this experience and we're sure it's one they won't forget.





Year 4 have enjoyed everything wet and watery this year. Having taken part in Estuary School, Lower Halstow, where they learned about the estuary as a waterway and all of the different animals and habitats found there. Additionally, visiting Horton Kirby River, they had the chance to consolidate Geography learning about rivers, their features and their uses.

Linking to their English learning of Shakespeare's Macbeth, Year 5e have been on a historic river boat tour in Canterbury, identifying the infamous witches ducking stool! Whilst there, they visited the Beaney Museum to have a hands-on Ancient Greek artefacts experience, supporting their learning in History





Year 6 certainly have got 'out-and-about' this year. Supporting the English work they have done on Charles Dickens' 'Great Expectations', Year 6 visited Rochester and Grain, where they tried to correctly identify the graveyard where Pip visited at the beginning of the book. They have also been building their independence and travel skills by catching the train up to London and visiting Kew Gardens, where they consolidated their learning of rainforests in Geography and adaptation in science.


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EKC FAMILY FACING THE FUTURE WITH RENOWNED FUTURIST NIKOLAS BADMINTON


