
MEET HOLYWELL PRIMARY SCHOOL



READING TOGETHER, LEARNING TOGETHER

At Holywell we want our children to know Reading is more than decoding and have the opportunity to engage in high-quality texts. In the last two years, we have been exploring and developing how we can improve Reading and ensure we were 'teaching' Reading not just hearing children read.

We now teach Reading to the whole class and challenge the children on their understanding using VIPERS questions which have made a big impact across the school.



We use this style of questioning with lots of genres including picture books, film clips, images, poems, and text passages.

This helps our children understand we have high expectations and they are not limited to a lower interest book because it is easier. We are proud of the ethos this has created and the enthusiasm of the staff, parents, and pupils. Our parents use VIPERS questions when they read at home and our children are showing more stamina when reading alone.

"All children have access to high quality, age-appropriate materials. Exposure to these has improved comprehension and vocabulary. Children are now regularly responding to a range of question types and identifying skills to do this best." Class Teacher

Initially, we were slightly nervous making the move from group reading to the whole class, but we feel proud of the impact on our teaching and would recommend taking the jump if you have not already.

Some exciting news we shared with our school community this term is that we are taking part in the Royal Shakespeare Company Associate Schools Programme. After many years of promoting the performing arts in our school, we feel this is a great step forwards in terms of being able to offer cultural opportunities not just to our children but to our entire Queenborough community.

We will hold the title of RSC Associate School for the next two academic years, during which time we will receive expert CPD from theatre practitioners (from both the RSC and the Marlowe Theatre, Canterbury) and explore some of Shakespeare's plays with our children who will have the opportunity to perform their work in professional venues in Kent and beyond. A number of our families took advantage of a special offer inviting them, as members of the Associate Schools Programme, to see the RSC's new production of The Comedy of Errors at the Marlowe Theatre during half term for free. We can't wait to hear what they thought of it!



We are hugely proud to be taking part in this project and look forward to connecting with schools across Kent who share our sion for creativity, arts and performance.

MEET OUR TEAM

Meet Andrew Harrison, Headteacher of Bysing-Wood Primary School in Faversham.



Starting his career in industry, Andrew retrained via a Primary/Secondary PGCE, though found the variety of teaching in the younger setting his preferred 'fit'.

After 12 years teaching and leading in two Thanet schools, he took up headship, at Bysing-Wood, in 2013. and after 8 years at the helm, he can't imagine working anywhere else.

With a new school year comes a new crop of newly qualified and early careers teachers. What advice would you offer our new colleagues?

- Commit to making professional decisions that will make a difference to the future success of children. There can be competing agendas within education which do not always benefit pupils and we need to be brave enough to pick the right path.
- Be a role model learner alongside the pupils. Take risks and learn from mistakes, try new things, be comfortable with not knowing (yet!), be curious about the world, expand your knowledge. Today I learnt, from Year 2, that there are sea cucumbers living in the coastal waters of the British Isles!
- Find joy in the progress and success of the children to keep you going when the frustrations of the profession build. What we do isn't 'just a job' so if you truly lose the enthusiasm for teaching, find another way to go.

8 months on and our third academic year, what are your hopes for 2021/22?

To have a full year where we can get back to the face-to-face aspects of school that has been so missed since the advent of Covid such as visits in the community, representative sport, inviting families into school for events, and collaborating with colleagues from the Trust in person.



REFLECTING ON...

WHY ACHIEVING EXCELLENCE IN PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT MATTERS

According to a report from the Children's Commissioner, "A large study, undertaken by the NHS in July 2020, found that clinically significant mental health conditions amongst children had risen by 50% compared to three years earlier. A staggering 1 in 6 children now has a probable mental health condition." (January 2021)

As leaders and educators, it is imperative that we remain aware, vigilant and informed about the pressures, anxieties and mental health needs of all children and young people. And whilst it is not in our sphere of expertise or our remit to be the medical professionals needed to provide the required therapeutic care, it is absolutely our role to ensure our curriculum is fit for purpose and supporting every one of our pupils and students to succeed, achieve and be ready for their next steps.

Therefore, it is our belief that strengthening the Personal Development Curriculum in our Educational Settings has never been more critical. The School's Commissioner reported, "All children and young people have missed out on non-academic experiences that make a childhood including opportunities to make new friends, play competitive sport, or participating in drama, music, and dance." June 2021

With so many children not being 'School Ready,' 'Secondary Ready', or 'College Ready' but still progressing into their next stage anyway, we



need to focus relentlessly on strengthening our offer to ensure we do everything we can to support success for all. The deliberate, intentional identification of barriers, opportunities and building a curriculum that truly meets the needs of the children and young people we serve today is the responsibility of us all.

The world changed, and now we need to change what we do and how we do it. For us, it starts with the personal development of our children and ends with their own personal success.
